

## **National Leader in 15 Manufacturing Sectors**





- CAGR of investments in manufacturing sector in the last 6 years is 19%, highest in India
- Gujarat's manufacturing sector contributes over 25% to the state GSDP, much higher than the national average
- Gujarat accounted for the maximum number of Industrial Entrepreneur Memorandums (IEMs) in India in 2015
- Robust base of large scale industries and over 2 million Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises providing employment to 15 million people

#### Pioneer in tapping unconventional sources of energy





- Second highest solar power installed capacity in India (1,130 MW)
- One of Asia's largest Solar Park (600 MW). Additional capacity to generate 100 MW of wind Power making it one of Asia's biggest solar-wind hybrid park
- World's first canal based solar power project



- Gross potential of **10,000 MW** of wind power
- Gujarat is one of the two states in India with promising potential for offshore wind projects



- House to India's first and one of Asia's biggest power plant based on biomass gasification

- Home to India's 1<sup>st</sup> private port (Pipavav), 1<sup>st</sup> dedicated Chemical Terminal (Dahej), 1<sup>st</sup> LNG regasification terminal (Dahej);
- Home to world's largest ship recycling yard (Alang)
- State with 1<sup>st</sup> Maritime Board and 1<sup>st</sup> Port Policy of India




Traffic at Gujarat non – major ports has grown at a CAGR of over 13% in the last 10 years to 340 Million Tonnes



## **Ease of Doing Business for Urban Development**



- Common Gujarat Development Control Regulations (GDCR) across the state which includes environmental and social safeguards
- *Common online application form* for construction permits and building plan approvals and is accessible on the 'Investment Facilitation Portal', an online single window facility for investors
- *AutoCAD software* to assess building plans for compliance with building codes for getting building permission on pilot basis
- System for *computerized allocation* of inspectors with computerized risk assessment to obtaining construction permit, occupancy certificate and compliance of shops & establishment act
